In November 2013, she was appointed by IU Director of Public Safety Jerry Minger and IU Bloomington Provost Lauren Robel as the Bloomington campus Police Chief.

In addition to her established police career, Flint is also a 2007 graduate of the FBI National Academy and lives in the Bloomington area with her husband and daughter.
